WAFSCM Legislative Committee Report

I hope everyone had a great summer. This last spring and summer were relatively quiet in the state legislation in regards to bills impacting flood management. However, with growing unpredictability of intensified climate change-related flooding and rainfall patterns, the WAFSCM legislative committee continues to work with and educate both houses of the state legislature on the need to maintain and improve Wisconsin higher standards for floodplain management. Particularly for what types of development will be allowed in the flood fringe and floodway. The committee is also encouraging the state legislature to work with state agencies to develop strategies that will help local communities become more resilient in the face of flooding events and assist them with their capacity to implement additional public safety-based measures adapted to the community-specific consequences of climate change.

As Chair of the Committee, I am also working to set up a meeting this fall with the WDNR Secretary, Preston Cole, to discuss ways our organization can assist the DNR in making the state more resilient to the impacts of climate change and increased flooding. This will involve both riverine and coastal flood and erosion risks. Please let me know if there are topics of interest that you would like me to bring up with the Secretary. Also, please inform me of any legislative or community actions that impact flood management that you feel might be of interest to WAFSCM.
